

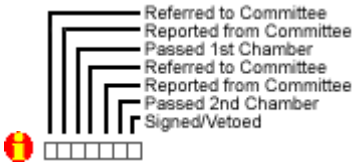

HB 65 [Pike, Patricia\(R\)](#) Modifies a definition relating to alcohol.

HB 157 Ellington, Brandon(D) Establishes provisions regarding the limited legalization of marijuana.

HB 108 Sommer, Chrissy(R) Designates May as "Mental Health Awareness Month" in Missouri.

HB 224 Ellebracht, Mark(D) Provides that a person may be charged with promoting a suicide attempt or voluntary manslaughter if such person is convicted of abusing certain persons and such conduct significantly contributed to the suicide or suicide attempt.

HB 251 Morris, Lynn(R) Establishes the Tricia Leann Tharp Act, which requires certain pharmacists to receive two hours of continuing education on suicide prevention.

Prescription Drugs/Opioids

HB 168 Rehder, Holly(R) Exempts health care entities registered with the Department of Health and Senior Services that distribute hypodermic needles or syringes from the crime of unlawful delivery of drug paraphernalia.

HB 188 Rehder, Holly(R) Establishes the Narcotics Control Act.

HB 642 Appelbaum, LaDonna(D) Requires the Department of Health and Senior Services to promulgate regulations consistent with CDC guidelines for prescribing opioids for chronic pain.
