WHAT IS SADD-OPOLY

SADD-opoly is a year-long program that promotes a strong, healthy SADD chapter, all based on the hit board game Monopoly. Chapters progress through the game-board over the course of the year, earning "dollars" for each space they complete.

All activities are based around building your chapter's capacity to succeed (see Activity Categories).

SADD-opoly runs from 9/1/21 - 5/15/22, with each activity having a completion date. Completion may require additional documentation delivered to Missouri SADD.

The chapters earning the most "dollars" each quarter, semester, and year will be recognized for their contributions and participation.

PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION COMMUNITIES

A Program Implementation Community (PIC) is a SADD chapter or other school prevention organization that focuses their efforts on fully implementing SADD's programming. Missouri SADD will directly support these chapters with programmatic and fiscal needs to spur grassroots efforts in the local community related to youth prevention. SADD chapters participating in SADD-opoly may become a PIC.

ACTIVITY CATEGORIES



Chapter Management - Building a thriving chapter will help build your school's capacity to provide safe decision making training to students and community members.



Advocacy - Connecting with government leaders at helps student members to understand their role in shaping public policy.



Events - Hosting events builds soft skills in teamwork, communication, and decision making while promoting causes important to SADD.



State Programs - Missouri SADD, in partnership with ACT Missouri, promotes numerous programs that focus on local and statewide issues regarding youth.



National Programs - National SADD has amassed a collection of industry partners to build a library of programs that focus on youth at a national level.



Leadership - Strong leaders are the catalyst for change for the future. Building the next generation of leaders will ensure the success of youth prevention efforts.



Media - Sharing the work of your SADD chapter can serve as a call to action while celebrating the successes of your chapter.



HOW TO PLAY

GETTING STARTED

To get started, download an <u>official</u> gameboard. You won't need anything else to play except the hard work of your students and community.

THE RULES

The gameboard moves in a logical order, with each side of the board representing a quarter, each half of the board a semester, and the whole board representing a whole year. Gameplay may begin anytime in the year but you cannot go back to uncompleted tasks after the quarter has ended; a chapter may work ahead, if necessary.

Each space on the board represents an activity for your SADD chapter, with a deadline to complete the task. Completing the task by deadline will earn you the dollars associated with the space.

Completing a task early is acceptable but does not earn any additional dollars. You may skip over tasks if your chapter chooses to not participate.

Detailed information on each task can be found in this guide. Some tasks may require you to submit documentation to Missouri SADD for proof of completion.


Not every activity may be possible in your SADD chapter, and acceptable activity modifications can be found in this guide.

RECOGNITION & FAQ

HOW TO EARN RECOGNITION

Each game period will recognize the SADD chapter with the most "dollars" earned. Chapters that start late are still encouraged to participate as they can earn recognition in further quarters and semesters - or even the year.

Chapters must complete an activity in its entirety to earn dollars, which will be tracked on the SADD-opoly leader board on ACT Missouri social media and the ACT Missouri website.

Winners of quarterly recognition will receive a certificate in the mail.

Winners of semester recognition will earn a plaque in the mail.

The winner of year long recognition will earn a poster for their school to display.

All chapters earning recognition will be recognized on social media.

FREQUENTLY ASKED OUESTIONS

Q. Do I have to start in quarter 1?

A. No. Game play is all year long and points increase as the game progresses through the year making it easy to catch up on points. In addition, there is quarterly and semester based recognition.

Q. What if I miss one of the required reporting documents like a photo?A. Contact the Missouri SADD State Office for alternative proof of completion if you miss a required reporting item.

Q. May I tweak a project slightly?

A. We know all schools are different, so if you need to make project modifications, please contact the SADD State Office.
